All club members must complete a Range Orientation Class consisting of approximately one hour of discussion prior to using the pistol and/or rifle ranges. If you are renewing your membership and have already completed the class, you do not have to complete the class a second time. If you are a new member or an existing member that has not completed the class, you may contact a person listed to arrange for the class time. All members and guests using the rifle, pistol, or 3D archery ranges are required to sign in at the lock box at the club entrance. To help defray range costs, guest pay \$5 per visit. (members are no charge). Everyone must also sign out when leaving the range. There is a small barn on a post at the gated club entrance with a sign

in/out clipboard inside. This requirement is for safety and to permit JCOC staff to know who is doing the shooting without traveling to the range. We do have occasional trespassers.




The speed limit is 15 mph on entrance and exit roads to JCOC. These are private drives. Please slow down and be a good neighbor.
