Regardless of the option the board decides upon, the gate has become a necessary evil to protect your club and the lake property owners from trespassers.

Board Meeting Notes

The January Membership and Board meeting were held at the clubhouse on Tuesday, January 2nd with 21 members present. The following actions were discussed and/or taken:



- 2 new members were welcomed and approved.
- 9 rentals have been scheduled so far for 2024.
- The range box held \$53. Activity for December was 40 on the rifle range, 30 on the pistol range and 9 used the archery range.
- Water issues at the clubhouse have been corrected.
- The kitchen fire suppression system passed inspection.
- State-wide deer hunting was down 11%. 30,000 less deer were harvested. The U.P. saw a overall decrease of 26%.
- The gate to the lake has been installed. It was noted that reflectors on the gate were needed. Corey Burns will address this issue.
- \$220 was approved for Sebastian Brothers for well cleaning.
- \$1000 was approved to Murph's Pumps for a second decontamination of the well.
- The modular rental lease extension for 2024 was approved.
- Mark and Char Baldwin will attend the MUCC annual convention this March in Sault Ste Marie.

A: All five of our residential programs provide the option for campers to complete the hunter safety course. Q: How many kids attend each week? A: Each week there are 50 registration spots. Q: Is payment due at the time of registration? A: Yes. Due to high demand, payment is required at the time of registration to secure your camper's spot.
