Membership & Board Meeting Notes

The June Membership and Board meeting were held at the clubhouse on Tuesday, June 4th with 30 members present. The following actions were discussed and/or taken:



- 12 new members were approved.
- Trap turned in \$1,235 for the month of May.
- Gross income from the Traditional Rendezvous was \$2,067 with expenses of \$532.29 leaving a net income of \$1,534.71. Way to go Archery Team!!
- \$1,075 was turned in for club rentals.
- \$299.76 was expended on 12 additional black plastic chairs.
- \$16 was turned in from the gun range box.
- JCOC has 220 paid memberships totaling 327 adult members.
- Repair has been done on a broken water line at the modular house. A new access door will also be installed at the house.
- \$330 was turned in from lake resident boat stickers. \$2,045 has been collected to date for boat stickers.
- The softener system has been removed pending receiving negative results for coliform from the tank.
- A quote of \$641 for materials to repair the pistol range roof was submitted. Another quote is being sought for materials with installation.
- A committee was established to look into insurance rates consisting of Richard Griggs, Mark Baldwin and Alex Moske.
- \$800 was approved to pay for septic tank pumping at the club house site.
- \$432 was authorized to purchase 3 dozen new JCOC logo hats.
- \$68 was authorized for stamps for mailing out newsletters to members with no email address.

Summer Clean-Up Days Scheduled!

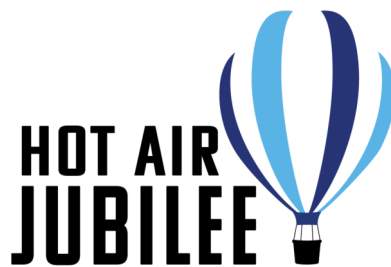
Mark your calendars for **Saturday, July 13th; Saturday, August 10th & Saturday, September 14th** starting at **8:00 a.m.**

Each year, MUCC hosts the Michigan Out-of-Doors (MOOD) Youth Camp Charity Shoot to raise funds for the MOOD Youth Camp in Chelsea, Michigan. We invite all shooters, from novices to sharpshooters, to join us at this event.

The event consists of a 12-station sporting clay course scored out of 50 clays. Medals and MUCC merchandise are awarded to the top team, top gun and top gun runner-up. Lunch and ammunition will be provided. Bring your own shotgun if you are able, but there will be reserve shotguns available. **Contact Steve Windom at swindom@mucc.org if you need to borrow either a 12ga or 20ga shotgun when registering.**

The funds raised also maintain and improve our historic facility and the continuation of programming about hunting, fishing, trapping and conservation education. We will be hosting around 200 campers this year — teaching hands-on skills like archery, fishing and kayaking.

ATTENTION MEMBERS: if you use the trap range area for throwing/shooting targets please CHECK the sign in sheet to make certain other members are NOT using the pistol—rifle—3D archery ranges. Be sure to use the far left trap house nearest the railroad bed. A DANGER exits if people are using the mentioned ranges and during trap shooting you shoot into the area. Thank you.

A reminder to sign in at the gate before entering the club grounds!! This allows members entering to be aware of where other members are on the property. Also remember to have your membership card with you. This is for safety purposes!!

A reminder that the speed limit is 15 mph on the entrance and exit roads to JCOC. This is a private drive which we share with several other neighbors. Kids and pets (along with assorted wildlife including deer and turkeys!) may be present so please be aware, slow down, and please use caution. Thank you!!
