Michigan's bear population continues to grow and grow. Reporting out recently through the DNR, our bear population in the UP is around 10,000 bears. In the northern Lower Peninsula (LP) our bear population is continuing to expand and is now around 3,000 bears. The bear population around our area is still quite light. Key thing about bear – they love bird feed!!! Like squirrels they love to invade bird feeders. If you sight a bear nipping away at your feeder, take your bird feeder down for a few weeks and the bear will leave looking for someplace else to find their goodies.

Our water well activity has been in a battle for consistency for potable water. We had to shut down the house for a few extra days in early April '25 due to failures in water sample results, tests required by our county and state laws. We are looking at further options with our softener, filtering or well. Iron filtering unit versus the softener is being investigated; tests for impurities continue. No movement yet until we find the resolve. Last time we had issues like this was back in 1979. Happy May 2025! Don't forget Mother's Day Brunch on May 11th!! Stop in for Clean-Up Day on May 10th!!!
